About the Estonian Wood Sector in 2020

- More than 1,000 companies were engaged in wood processing and furniture production employing approximately 18,000 people.*
- About 12-14% of people in South-East Estonia region work for the wood sector.
- 3/4 of Estonian wood and furniture companies employ 1 to 9 people (74%) and 93% of all companies have less than 50 employees (small companies).
- The number of micro-enterprises is actually much higher, as lot of entrepreneurs have not registered as employees of the company. (The data of the Commercial Register)
